

Universal Credit – Managed Migration SE

The government has started the process of moving all benefit claimants onto Universal Credit (UC) in Sandwell.

What is Managed Migration?

Managed Migration is the DWP's approach for moving households on legacy benefits over to Universal Credit.

The benefits affected are:

- Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Income Support
 Housing Benefit
- Child Tax Credits
 Working Tax Credits

What do affected residents need to do?

Residents claiming a legacy benefit will be notified by letter when they need to claim UC. This letter – called a Migration Notice – will provide the date by which you need to make your claim and details of the support available.

You will have three months to make your claim. If you fail to claim within this time, your benefits will end.

Residents claiming Tax Credits who are of State Pension Age will be sent a letter to apply for either Universal Credit or Pension Credit, depending upon your circumstances. You are advised to get a full benefit check from a local advice provider as soon as you receive your Migration Notice.

When is this happening?

Managed Migration in Sandwell started in February 2024. The final group of claimants asked to move will be those receiving Income-related Employment and Support Allowance, who will be asked to claim sometime between September 2024 and December 2025.

What if I need support with my UC claim?

If you are a council tenant you can contact Sandwell Council's Rents Team on **0121 737 5148** from Monday to Thursday 9am to 5.30pm and 9am to 5pm on a Friday for advice and support.

D-Day heroes remembered

As the nation marked the 80th anniversary of D-Day last month, we remembered those who served at the historic Normandy landings.



Among them was Smethwickborn Lieutenant Den Brotheridge, widely believed to have been the first Allied servicemen to be killed by enemy action on D-Day, 6 June 1944.

Lieutenant Brotheridge led his platoon in 'Operation Deadstick', which used gliders to capture German-held bridges, preventing

enemy tanks from reaching the Normandy beaches and the Allied soldiers landing there.

The operation was a success and the bridges were taken. However, while crossing what later came to be known as Pegasus Bridge, Brotheridge was killed by enemy fire. His only daughter, Margaret, was born three weeks later.

Of her father's sacrifice, Margaret said: "It is important to remember and take pride in what my father's generation did and their commitment to freedom in Europe."



On 6 June, Sandwell Council joined with the Royal British Legion, uniformed groups, residents, schoolchildren and Deputy Lieutenant for the West Midlands, John Wood, for a service in Oldbury Civic Square. We remembered all who served including those who never returned home.



Measles and whooping cough

Measles and whooping cough continue to circulate in Sandwell and people are urged to check vaccinations are up to date.

Remember measles is highly contagious. Two doses of the MMR vaccine will provide 99% protection against measles and rubella.

In March, we worked with NHS England and NHS Black Country Integrated Care Board to deliver vaccination clinics to schools, targeting those with the lowest uptake of MMR vaccinations. Nearly 300 children were vaccinated.

If you need to check if you or your children need the MMR vaccine, contact your GP practice. It's not too late to catch up on any missed doses.

We're planning further catch-up vaccination clinics throughout Sandwell. Please keep an eye on Sandwell Council's social media for

Meanwhile, cases of whooping cough continue to rise across the UK.

If you're pregnant, it's important to get the whooping cough vaccine to protect your newborn baby, as they are at greatest risk.

Pregnant women can get the vaccine from their midwives, antenatal clinics and local GP from 16 weeks of pregnancy.

The project, which originally helped women in any part of the criminal justice system but has now expanded to support any woman, received an award for its work from The Butler Trust in 2023.

Signage goes up at state-of-the-art hospital

Official signage has started to go up across the Midland **Metropolitan University Hospital.**

Opening later this year and run by Sandwell and West Birmingham NHS Trust, it will be one of the biggest hospitals to open in the UK in the past 10 years.

With the name now emblazoned in the signature orange colour across the front of the building in Smethwick, the organisation is working with construction giants Balfour Beatty to prepare for handover.

It will house one large accident and emergency department, bringing together the two A&E services currently operating at Birmingham's City Hospital and Sandwell Hospital.

Jayne Dunn, Director of Commissioning & Equipping at Midland Met, said: "Seeing the main signage go up for the hospital, A&E, the children's department and maternity will bring the project to life for our communities and heralds the opening is just around the corner."





Introducing Midland Metropolitan University Hospital









Midland Metropolitan University Hospital will bring together all acute and emergency care services currently at City and Sandwell Hospitals.

Our two existing emergency departments will combine to create a new one at Midland Metropolitan University Hospital.

The new hospital will look after people who need emergency care or who are seriously unwell.

Midland Met includes:

- Advanced emergency services with a purpose-built emergency department complemented by co-located imaging and diagnostic services.
- A dedicated children's emergency department with assessment unit.
- A midwifery-led birth unit, delivery suite, neonatal unit and antenatal services.
- Over 730 beds with 50 per cent of rooms on wards being en-suite.
- 13 operating theatres, 13 adult inpatient wards, 2 children's wards and 2 maternity wards.
- The regional hub for sickle cell and thalassaemia care, offering specialised services and expertise.



Stay alert this summer

The summer months are packed full of fun activities, and Counter Terrorism Policing West Midlands are reminding you to stay vigilant and let us know if you see something that doesn't feel right.



Whether you're off to sporting events, music festivals or simply a day out in town, it's important to stay alert to your surroundings.

Superintendent Nick Rowe, from Counter Terrorism Policing West Midlands, said: "While our advice is not based on an increased threat to the area or events, we're reminding residents of the importance of staying alert and reporting anything that seems suspicious or doesn't feel right.

"We have dedicated officers working around the clock to keep the region safe, but reports from the public are vital in supporting our efforts.

"We want everyone to have a safe and enjoyable summer so trust your instincts and if you spot something suspicious – report it straight away. The smallest piece of information might be vital and you'll never be wasting our time."

New places where you can report a hate crime

Four new organisations have recently joined the Sandwell Hate Crime Third Party Reporting Centre Network with over 40 centres now in operation.



The centres are spaces in the local community where people can report a hate crime, if they do not wish to directly report this to the police, with the centres then passing the information on to the police themselves.

Staff at Abrahamic Foundation and West Smethwick Park Pavilion, both in Smethwick, Bangladeshi Women's Association in Tipton and South Staffs Water Community Hub in Wednesbury have received training and can now forward reports of hate crime on behalf of victims to the police.

The centres can also help victims of hate crime in Sandwell to access victim support services dedicated to hate crime.

One year on — big successes at Sandwell Aquatics Centre

Since opening to the public on 24 July 2023, Sandwell Aquatics Centre, Smethwick, has attracted nearly 12,000 attendees to our diving programme.

The Learn to Dive programmes boast nearly 200 customers and 125 squad members, making over 300 weekly attendances.

Sandwell Diving Club is affiliated with Swim England, with members competing nationally in skills, age groups and junior elites.

Our first-year diver Kalila, pictured top right, achieved personal bests on the 3m and 10m boards, finishing sixth overall with a new personal best in our most recently hosted event, Junior

Three swimming clubs - Haden Hill, Oldbury and Warley Wasps – successfully merged to form Sandwell Aquatics Club, delivering both swimming and water polo. The club has swimmers competing at the national Aquatics GB Summer Championships in Sheffield.

Hero Sandwell binman rescues couple and dog from house fire Sandwell bin man Steve Whitehouse was praised for his heroic actions after rescuing a man,

a woman and a dog during his round.

Serco employee Steve, known as Winnie, was on his trade waste round with driver Kevin Marriott when they spotted the blaze at a maisonette in Ridgeway Road, Tipton. He climbed to a first-floor balcony three times to rescue the trio.

Steve, who's worked as a Refuse Operative in Sandwell since 2007, said: "I saw a young woman screaming from the balcony and all I could think was that I needed to get to her as quickly as possible.

"The smoke was getting thicker. I called to anyone else who might be inside and could hear a young man shouting in distress for his dog. I managed to bundle up the dog in a blanket, jumped back down to the ground, and got the owner to throw the dog to me. I then went back up to help him."

Once Steve had completed the rescues, he started banging on neighbours' doors to alert them to the danger. Kevin tended to neighbours who'd evacuated their homes for safety and let Steve's family know what was happening.

Once they'd recovered over a strong cup of tea, the pair continued with their round.

Tipton Watch Commander Chris Green, for West Midlands Fire Service, said: "I have no doubt that, without Steve's incredible bravery, the outcome could have been very different."

The fire was caused by an e-bike battery exploding while on charge at the bottom of the stairs, cutting off an escape route – see page 17 for advice on reducing the risks of fire when charging e-bikes and e-scooters or go to www.wmfs.net/safety/e-bikes

New college campus officially opened

It was great to officially open Sandwell College's Central Saint Michael's Sandwell Science, Engineering & Manufacturing **Centre in West Bromwich High Street.**

More than 220 students are now able to enjoy their learning at the new facility.

Students can work in a range of electrical and mechanical labs, digital computer labs and computer aided design (CAD) studios.

Also, in a first for the Black Country, a 'Festo suite' is available to prepare people, companies and organisations for the digital future in production and new technologies.

The project was funded by the government's Towns Fund programme, with co-funding from Sandwell College and the Department for Education.



Work starts on new Britannia Park changing rooms

Four new Football Association-approved changing rooms will mean people can make full use of the Rowley Regis park's sport pitches.

We'll also work with a voluntary sector organisation to promote the use of the grass pitches to help grow junior and women's football.

This is the latest phase of Britannia Park improvements. New allotment beds are finished and work is already under way

By improving facilities, families and children will have more opportunities to participate in activities including tennis, basketball, netball, cricket and football as well as events and to use the

new play area.

Improvements are funded by the government's Towns Fund, Sandwell Council and the Lawn Tennis Association.

council homes in Tipton, supported by the government's Levelling Up Fund, remain on track.

Tenants from both Union Street blocks have moved to alternative premises.

The shops are also now vacant, some businesses choosing to relocate nearby.

The Post Office has secured premises in Unity Walk so this vital service can continue to serve the town with reopening scheduled for later this summer after a refit.

Work has begun to strip out the two Union Street blocks, ahead of demolition which begins later in 2024. Design work is now complete with a planning application submitted to seek approval to build the new apartments.

The council has commissioned urban design specialists to advise on improvements along Owen Street, Union Street and the canal walkway.

They will offer guidance on traffic calming, walking routes, street tree planting and play facilities, all aimed at making Tipton a safer, more attractive centre, designed around people's needs.

WEDNESBURY

Work has started on the £20.4million Wednesbury Levelling Up Partnership.

We have installed new and upgraded CCTV cameras and have started improving green spaces with new planting and better paths and lighting.

Further work will take place in 2024 and 2025 to:



- Help the town centre thrive through improvements including new paving, more seating and greenery, and agreeing a masterplan to attract further investment
- Help partners tackle crime and anti-social behaviour by engaging with residents and businesses and making changes in green spaces to discourage nuisance bikes
- Prepare land at Friar Park Urban Village ready to build 630 new homes
- Improve green spaces at Lakeside and Norbury Open Space, Hydes Road Playing Fields, Balls Hill Open Space and Wyntor Lane Open Space
- Expand the Friar Park Millennium Centre so there's more space for a wider range of services to help give people the skills they need to secure better jobs

In September 2023, Sandwell Council and the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities agreed the programme that will be delivered as part of their Levelling Up Partnership.

SMETHWICK In October 2023, Smethwick was named as one of 55 towns to receive up to £20million funding from the government over a 10-year period to invest in local people's priorities.

To access the funding, the Smethwick Partnership Board, with support of Sandwell Council, is producing a Long-Term Plan for Smethwick based on local priorities.

An online survey was launched to get the views of residents, businesses and community groups to help identify the priorities for Smethwick. There's still time to have your say in the survey at www.smethwickltp.co.uk - closing date 28 July 2024.

The plan will be submitted to the government in August.


