Work Taster - Work Taster - Work Taster – Work Taster





Thank to Jon and the team at **CMT Engineering** in Cradley Heath, who are currently providing work tasters to our LSE (Local Supported Employment) job seekers.

Gaining exposure to different work environments is important for young job seekers, especially those with limited work experience.

Dylan (pictured) demonstrated excellent attention to detail, picked up the work quickly and enjoyed the experience.

In 'supported employment' we use 'place and train' for our jobseekers. This means that vocational learning best takes place in a real work setting.



Local Supported Employment Initiative

The Specialist Employment Team have grant funding from the Department for Work and Pensions to deliver the Local Supported Employment Initiative.

The Local Supported Employment Initiative helps adults with *learning disabilities* and *autism* move into and sustain employment.

The Local Supported Employment Initiative started in November 2022 and we will be supporting up to 80 jobseekers.

So far, 16 customers have started work or have a job offer and are waiting to start work.

12 customers who have been in work for more than 6 months, 11 have sustained their job for 26 weeks

22 LSE customers are still looking for paid employment.

We've had great feedback from both customers we have supported on the LSE programme and employers.



If you are looking for paid work, have a learning disability or autism and live Sandwell, we may be able to help you find a job. Your job coach will talk to your about the type of job you want and together you will plan how to get your job. Your job coach will contact employers on your behalf and talk to them about jobs for you. They will meet with you regularly and support you in the workplace to help you learn your job.
