

**THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF SANDWELL**

**(Sandwell Borough, Consolidation of Waiting and Loading Restrictions) (Traffic Regulation Order No. 14) (Amendment No. 2) Order 2024**

NOTICE is hereby given that the Borough Council of Sandwell (“the Council”) has made the above named Order under Sections 1, 2 and 4 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the 1984 Act”) and all other enabling powers and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act.

This Order will come into operation on [28<sup>th</sup> February 2025]. The effect of this Order is to amend The Borough Council of Sandwell (Sandwell Borough, Consolidation of Waiting and Loading Restrictions) (Traffic Regulation Order No. 14) 2019 (“the 2019 Order”) as follows:

- a. Replace part of the existing Limited Waiting Mon-Sat 8am-6pm 2 hours no return within 3 hours bay with a No Waiting at Any Time restriction on **High Street, West Bromwich**, south-west side, from a point 2 metres south-east of the common boundary of No. 60 and 62 for a distance of 24 metres in a north-westerly direction.

Please note that the following element of this scheme proposal that was advertised [10<sup>th</sup> October 2024] will be abandoned and will therefore not form part of this permanent scheme;

- a. **High Street, West Bromwich**, south-west side, from a point 23 metres south-east of its junction with Florence Road for a distance of 9 metres in a south-easterly direction.

A copy of the Order, together with plans showing the lengths of road affected and a statement of the Council's reasons for making the Order, may be inspected at Sandwell Council House, Freeth Street, Oldbury, West Midlands, B69 3DE during usual opening hours and online at [www.sandwell.gov.uk](http://www.sandwell.gov.uk).

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order may within six weeks from the date of the making of the Order apply to the High Court for this purpose.
